Movement concepts are introduced in a playful and creative way through the exploration of well-known stories and music.

Our program is designed to ignite imaginations while also promoting physical and cognitive development with strong, point-at-able link to EYLF outcomes.

Learning Objectives

- Students will use their listening skills to perform ballet movements and positions
- Students will explore movements and expressive actions reflecting animals and natural elements in various contexts inspired by a story
- Students will communicate verbally and non-verbally to express ideas

Moving Stories guides students through a ballet-inspired physical warm up incorporating numeracy and language games. Student dancers then work together, led by their Queensland Ballet Teaching Artist, to explore the narrative, characters, environments and social themes of well-known story through fun movement games and activities. Relevant at any time of year and adaptable to suit themes of study.
