POSITION PURPOSE

The Principal Cutter plays a key role in the creation of Queensland Ballet's costumes by developing precise patterns based on the interpretation of designs provided by Costume Designers and Stylists. The Principal Cutter works closely with the Costume Workroom Manager and Costumiers to ensure costumes meet the highest artistic and technical standards for Queensland Ballet's productions, remounts, hired productions, and other events.

REPORTING

The Principal Cutter reports directly to the Costume Workroom Manager and collaborates with the Head of Costume, Costume Designers, Stylists, and Costumiers.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Develop and cut costume patterns in consultation with the Head of Costume, Costume Workroom Manager, Costume Designers, and Stylists. Work closely with Costumiers to ensure costumes are constructed to design specifications and artistic intent.
- Maintain Queensland Ballet's high standards in costume construction, alterations, and finishing, ensuring consistency across productions.
- Provide material requirements and labour estimates when necessary to support accurate budgeting for new costumes and refurbishment projects.
- Organise and conduct costume fittings in collaboration with the QB Artistic Department. Document costume allocations, remount considerations, and report any necessary alterations or issues to the Head of Costume and Costume Workroom Manager within budget and production timelines.
- Support the professional development of the costume team by sharing expertise and assisting with upskilling initiatives for both new and existing staff.
- Execute costume construction and additional tasks as required to support the smooth operation of the costume department.
- Adhere to all Queensland Ballet Workplace Health and Safety regulations and best practices.

KEY ATTRIBUTES AND SKILLS

- Expertise in pattern making, costume construction, and alterations.
- Strong time management skills with the ability to work under pressure and meet tight deadlines.
- Flexibility to work collaboratively within a team while also demonstrating the ability to work independently.
- Excellent communication skills to liaise effectively with multiple departments and stakeholders.

- High level of professionalism, attention to detail, creative problem solving and commitment to artistic excellence.
- Understanding of theatre operations, production processes, and backstage etiquette.

- 2. Demonstrated expertise in pattern making and advanced costume construction techniques.

- 4. Strong ability to take direction and provide constructive input while maintaining respectful and collaborative relationships with colleagues.
